Step One

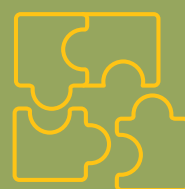
Gather information

Purpose: To understand more about the initiative

What: Online questionnaire

Who is involved: Anyone with an interest or involvement in your initiative

Time involved: 10 minutes



Step Two

Identify outcomes

Purpose: To identify what your initiative aims to achieve and why

What: Collaborative workshop

Who is involved: Anyone with an involvement in your initiative

Time involved: 2 hours



Step Three

Identify key questions

Purpose: To identify what to measure about your initiative

What: Collaborative workshop

Who is involved: One or two people, responsible for the evaluative inquiry

Time involved: 2 hours



Step Four:

Collect data

Purpose: To collate and collect the data that answers the questions

What: Data collection guided by a comprehensive implementation plan

Who is involved: One or two people, responsible for the evaluative inquiry

Time involved: Varies



Step Five

Sense making

Purpose: Understand the data, go forth and be awesome!

What: Collaborative workshop

Who is involved: One or two people, responsible for the evaluative inquiry

Time involved: 2 hours
